- Acceptance Receiving another person willingly and unconditionally, especially when the other's behavior has been imperfect. Being willing to continue to love another in spite of offenses. (Romans 15:7)
- Building Encouraging others to become all that God has called them to be. Promoting others above themselves.1 Thessalonians 5:11
- 3. **Compassion** Feeling the pain of others and doing all that is possible to relieve them. (1 Peter 3:8)
- 4. **Creativity** Finding Godly solutions to difficult problems. Discovering practical applications for spiritual principles (Romans 12:12, 21)
- 5. **Decisiveness** Finalizing difficult decisions on the basis of God's ways, word and will. (Joshua 24:15)
- 6. **Deference** Limiting my freedom to not offend those God has called me to serve. (Romans 12:10)
- Diligence Seeing every task as an assignment from the Lord and applying energy and concentration to accomplish it. (Colossians 3:23-24)
- Discernment/Sensitivity Knowing what to look for in evaluating people, problems and things. Saying right words at the right time. (Eph. 4:29)
- 9. Endurance/Perseverance -Maintaining commitment to what is right during times of pressure. (Romans 5:3-4)
- Faith Developing an unshakable confidence in God's Word and visualizing God's will and acting upon it. (Hebrews 11:6)
- 11. **Forgiveness** Choosing not to hold an offense against another, remembering how much God has forgiven us. (Ephesians 4:32)

- 12. **Gratefulness** Recognizing the benefits which God and others have provided, looking for appropriate ways to express genuine appreciation. (Ephesians 5:20)
- 13. **Humility** Recognizing our total inability to accomplish anything good apart from God's grace. Recognizing our fundamental "neediness." (Ephesians 4:2)
- 14. **Initiative** Taking steps to seek after God with our whole heart; giving first rather than waiting for others to give. (Luke 6:38)
- 15. **Justice** Doing what is right even when no one is looking. Standing up for those who have no voice with integrity and lack of compromise. (Proverbs 31:9)
- Kindness Responding to needs with kindness and love. Acting appropriately to meet the emotional needs of others. (Colossians 3:12)
- 17. **Loyalty** Adopting as your own the wishes and goals of those you are serving. (Colossians 3:22)
- Meekness Yielding our rights and possessions to God. Being willing to earn the right to be heard rather than demanding a hearing. (1 Peter 5:6)
- Nobleness Recognizing that all possessions belong to God. Learning how to be a wise steward of time, money and possessions. (Proverbs 10:22)
- 20. **Obedience** Accepting difficult assignments as from God without giving Him a deadline to do anything specifically. Learning from all experiences. (2 John 6)



- Punctuality Showing esteem for other people and their time by not keeping them waiting. (Philippians 2:3-4)
- Quietness Showing strength in times of stress by stepping back and gaining God's perspective. (Isaiah 30:15)
- Reverence Demonstrating to God and others respect for authority and the character of God. (Proverbs 1:7)
- 24. **Security** Exhibiting freedom from fear; entrusting our needs and expectations to Christ based upon His eternal Word. (Psalm 53:6)
- 25. **Truthfulness** Expressing what is right without misrepresenting the facts. Facing the consequences of a mistake. Telling the whole truth. (Ephesians 4:25)
- 26. **Understanding** Responding to the needs of others with kindness and love. Knowing what is appropriate to meet the emotional needs of others. (Galatians 6:2)
- 27. Virtue Demonstrating personal moral standards, which cause others to desire a more Godly life. (Proverbs 11:3)
- Wisdom Applying knowledge gained through experience to help others who need wisdom. Advancing the Kingdom of God by stepping into a position of leadership. (James 1:5)
- 29. **eXcellence** Choosing to do everything with attention to detail and complete follow through. (Colossians 3:23-24)
- Yielding Working favorably with others, cooperating and easily coming to terms with the best way to solve problems in ways that benefit all. (James 3:17)
- Zeal Eagerly committed & passionate about obeying God and doing what is right for the right reasons (Romans 12:11)
